

Robins Class Spring 2



yr 3 and 4 Swimming session Thursday - **Forest School** session **Wednesday afternoon** and PE Friday.

**Reading** - Along with accessing our Little Wandle reading books, as a class, we will explore 'Moving' by Michael Rosen and 'Grandad's Island', Benji Davis.

Our **writing** sessions this half-term will use the text 'If All the World Were' by Joseph Coelho to help us to learn and apply poetic techniques. We will then use another title by the same author, 'Our Tower' to further extend our knowledge of poetry as well as setting descriptions, diary entries and dialogue.

**Maths** coverage will include fractions and mass and capacity for children in Year 3 and Year 4. Our Year 2 Robins will continue to work on their multiplication and division skills, followed by mass and capacity and length and height.



Our **PE** sessions will be swimming on a Thursday, at Haverhill Pool and **Forest School on Wednesday** and **PE on Friday afternoon**.



**Spellings** - We will continue to use the Little Wandle programme 'Bridge to Spelling', learning about the rules and strategies involved in spelling and not just rote learning how to spell a list of words.

**Music** - these sessions include regular playing school's instruments and even reading sheet music!



Our Computing unit for this half-term includes learning the skills to 'creating media' in particular, desktop publishing.

In **Science**, our focus turns to rocks and soils, along with fossils. If you have any interesting examples of rocks or fossils - and willing to share!



**Geography** - We will continue to investigate 'Who lives in Antarctica?'  
**History** - 'What did the Ancient Egyptians believe?' continues to be our focus in Spring 2.

French - Our French learning will include the story Les quatre amis - the four friends.

**RE** - moves on to our second 'Big Question' - What beliefs drive people to make a difference in the world?  
Christianity - What do Christians mean when they talk about the Kingdom of God?

**Design Technology** - DT - follows the theme of 'Structures' this half-term, where we will plan and then create a pavilion.

**PSHE** - Citizenship is the focus for our PSHE lessons, which are enhanced by our Forest School sessions.

**Art** - will use skills learnt in previous units to recreate items based upon those from the 'Ancient Egyptian' time period.
