Pupil Progress

We are changing the way we share information with families about their child's learning and progress in the Spring Term. Each year group will be invited to attend a workshop led by the class teacher. At the end of the workshop written feedback for your child will be available along with their books. A letter has been sent home and dates are also detailed below.

Mobile Phone Use

As you may be aware there has been media coverage this week about the impact of mobile phones in children's rooms at night. As part of our pastoral care and whole child emphasis, we are concerned that some children are communicating with each other using their phones and tablets after they have gone to bed. We would strongly encourage families to ensure they have the appropriate settings on their devices and internet parental controls are in place as, on occasion, upsets sent by social media have impacted on the school learning day. We will be sending a parent information sheet as part of our Safer Internet Day planned for 11th February 2020, but do please contact the school if you would like further advice or guidance.

Parking

With so many parents bringing pupils to school by car we wish to emphasise the safe parking message to everyone. The Five Bells car park is available to park in on the side nearest the village green. The side nearest the pub is private, and we ask you to respect this. Parking beyond the Church is possible but is often difficult, so the village is the best option. Thank you for your cooperation in this. Please respect the need for children's visibility when crossing the road by not parking on the yellow lines under any circumstances. This supports the school when children are visiting the local area and also helps children who are walking home independently to be safe when crossing the road.

Homework and Home Support for Learning

Can we please remind parents of the importance of supporting children's learning at home. It is essential that reading, spelling and times tables are completed on a daily basis to ensure that skills and knowledge are committed to long term memory. Naturally, this work is differentiated according to your child's age and ability and may range from tricky word sounds and phonic blends, up to extended chapter reading of classic novels. All statutory spellings and grammar terms are available at the back of your child's planner; please use these to support home learning. The planner also contains relevant information about mathematical knowledge and content and all families have access to online MyMaths which contains many tutorials and practice sessions. Ten or fifteen minutes a day is enough to make a significant difference and will really impact on your child's learning. It is one of the best supports you can offer as a parent and is more powerful than one long session at the weekend. Thank you to those families who are already committed to this daily learning slot. The impact is evident in the classroom.

With research homeworks children are always able to attend lost learning sessions, in advance of the hand in date, to use school computers and printers, if you are unable to support this at home. We would prefer this rather than information being sent in on a stick, to avoid compromise to our security systems – Many thanks
