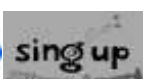
We hope you all have an enjoyable and restful half term at home with your families. For those of you who have kept up well with your virtual learning this will enable you to have a real break of curriculum. Equally for those who have gaps in their learning, this is an opportunity to catch up to ensure your child is at the same starting point as their peers for the beginning of Spring Term 2. The Government expectation following the introduction of remote learning on Google classrooms, is that work will always be set when the school is closed regardless of reason. We would not want any child to miss out on experiencing seasonal weather such as snow, but families should be aware that learning was scheduled online for Monday and Tuesday and this is sequential in nature. Children who did not complete their learning on Monday and Tuesday will be disadvantaged in subsequent lessons as a degree of competence is assumed. Class teachers will always ensure that there is a mix between core learning and wider experiences and, as a Church of England school, it is fitting to spend some time experiencing awe and wonder of the natural world.

Covid-19 notification of a positive test result - Please note that it is essential that the school is notified by email (admin@cavendish.suffolk.sch.uk) if you or a member of your family receives a positive test result during half term. This is in addition to following government expectations for isolation and social distancing.

World Book Day – Thursday 4th March We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday, 4th March both in school and at home. Our theme this year will be 'Family Favourites'. We would very much like to see how you share reading at home. This may be as a photograph, book review, audio/visual recording, picture or just a posted recommendation in your class chat. 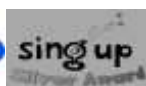


Challenge, Creativity, Compassion: Create a pure heart in me – Psalm 51:10
