<u>Clubs</u>

Wake and Shake Club is open to all years and starts promptly at 8.30am. There is no admittance to the club after this time. Doors open for school at 8.45am. All other clubs will commence on Monday 13th January. We are very grateful to the staff and volunteers who give up their time to enrich the curriculum. Please note that once a child has been given a club place, attendance is expected weekly. In the event that a club is significantly undersubscribed, the school may decide not to offer this provision in the interests of best value spending.

Absence and Late Arrival

Parents are reminded that regular attendance at school is essential in order for children's progress not to be disrupted. All schools are now set attendance targets and as a result it is only possible to authorise leave of absence during term time if there is an exceptional reason, therefore no planned absences are authorised unless they meet the county's strict guidelines. A Leave of Absence form should be completed and returned to the school. Forms are available from the school office.

A reminder that registration closes at 9.00am. Children who are not in their classroom by this time will be marked as 'Late'. Early bird (from 8.45am) is a valuable time when children get to read and reflect on the previous day's learning and respond to their marking comments. Class Teachers and support staff use this time to give individuals a little extra support for reading, grammar, tables and spelling – if your child is not there, they cannot benefit! In addition year 6 have specific work set for 9.00-9.15am which really does take the whole 15 minutes. If your child walks to school independently, please check they are coming via the most direct route.

Absences should be telephoned in and then confirmed in writing once your child returns to school. If your child has been unwell, please provide a copy of a Doctor's appointment card or a written letter. This is requested for the school to be able to verify reasons for absence to the Education Welfare Service. You can leave a message on the school answerphone at any time. Mrs Fenn is available on the door from 8.45am for informal enquiries, and the office is fully staffed from 9.00am. Thank you.

Playtime

Children will need a change of footwear, preferably wellington boots before they are allowed on the field in poor weather. If your child already has wellington boots in school, please check the size to ensure they still fit comfortably. It is most helpful if these are named on the sole so we can read them when they are on the welly pegs. You may wish to include a pair of plain joggers to pull on over school trousers. Joggers should also be provided in your child's PE kit.

Medicine Permission

Following guidance from the Department for Education, a 'Record of medicine administered to an individual child' form must be completed should you wish the school to administer medicine to your child during the school day. If your child receives long term medication in school, a separate letter will follow. Forms and more information are available from the school office.

Dinner money

Thank you to those who pay for their dinners every Monday. Please send the correct money for your payment in your envelope. Dinners are £2.30 per day. If you wish you may pay by cheque made payable to Suffolk County Council. **Dinners are payable in advance**. There is a new menu for the Spring Term which has been sent home.

Free School Meals

Suffolk County Council is committed to promoting the health and well-being of children, providing assistance for children from entitled households to have their meals free of charge while at school. Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit but not the Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenues & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work less hours per week
- Universal Credit

Whether actually taken or not, Free School Meals registration triggers additional sources of funding for your child's education, should this be required. We would therefore urge all who think they may be eligible to apply, even if you are a committed eater of packed lunches! Please see Miss Wass if you would like to discuss this further.

This is especially important for children in Year R, 1 and 2, as parents may not realise that applying for this status qualifies their child for Pupil Premium Money. Details of the impact pupil premium money has had for children in our school can be found on our website.
