Nature of support 2014/15

Children's individual needs were analysed against the evidence of impact of the following support strategies as detailed in the Education Endowment Foundation and Sutton Trust research tool.

This led to pupil premium spending and provision in the following areas:

- Increased provision in arts and sports
- Purchase of ICT & software to support & develop skills i-pads
- Talk for learning - ELKLAN support
- Small group study time developing skills about the learning process to increase understanding and self-belief
- Ensuring communication with staff within school and liaison with feeder settings as part of transition
- The school has provided additional funding over and above Pupil Premium to ensure that all children benefit from small focussed groups

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2014/15

The focus of Pupil Premium spending in the academic year 2014 -2015 was to reduce identified gaps and raise standards in communication, reading, writing and maths. To ensure that children were confident users of ICT alongside their peers.

More able children were stretched through extension challenge groups.

Some children received additional support for fine motor skills, social groups and behaviour for learning strategies.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The impact of Pupil Premium provision is reviewed termly through analysis of each child's progress and achievement, and resulting improvement in self-esteem.

End of year achievement is compared to earlier starting points for each child, and against both cohort achievement and national standards.

End of Key Stage 2 children made accelerated progress compared to their peers in 2014-15. Expected progress from KS1 to KS2 is 12 points. PP/E6 children achieved 16 points progress in English and maths; non PP/E6 made 14.5 in English and 13 in maths.

End of Key Stage 1 expected points progress is 10 points. PP/E6 made 10.5 for English, in line with National Expectations, however this is lower than non PP/E6 progress at 13.2. Strategies to support further development of writing will continue into year 3. Pupil progress for maths is in line with non PP/E6 at 12 and 12.1 points progress respectively, both above national expectations..

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Curriculum Focus for PPG spending 2015-16

- Increased adult ratios for the teaching of phonics in EYFS and KS1
- Small group work for guided reading and reading comprehension strategies
- Focus support group work (teacher/LSA led) to increase feedback through quality first teaching and focussed marking
- Extension groups for more able reading, writing, maths, grammar
- Individual tuition (1-1, small group) from qualified teaching staff linked to specific need (eg precision monitoring, phonics, writing, problem solving)
- Individual funding to enable children to access school visits & clubs from external providers

In addition to the support strategies detailed above, some PPG spending will focus this year on providing holistic and emotional well being support such as forest schools.
