Nature of support 2015/16

The focus of Pupil Premium spending in the academic year 2015/16 is to reduce identified gaps and raise the standards in communication, reading, writing and maths. More able children are stretched through extension challenge groups.

A significant focus this year has been around the development of our new Forest School area. This includes development of a dedicated area of our school grounds, professional training for staff and hire of a qualified Forest School instructor and associated equipment; Forest Schools will enable us to offer high quality provision to support emotional and physical wellbeing where children are able to explore their natural surroundings, work as a team, solve practical based problems and experience awe and wonder in God's world.

Each child in receipt of PP has a costed provision map detailing how they are supported in school. Additional support could include combinations of the following:

- Focus support group work (teacher/LSA led)
- Additional support in classroom through use of LSAs linked to reading, writing and maths.
- Extension groups for more able
- Individual tuition from qualified teaching staff linked to specific need (eg precision monitoring, phonics, writing, problem solving)
- After school tuition
- Specific purchase of resources such as ICT software to extend
- Support to develop fine and gross motor skills
- Support for language and communication needs
- Support for social groups
- Ensuring communication with staff within school and liaison with feeder settings as part of transition

The school has provided additional funding over and above Pupil Premium to ensure that all children benefit from small focused groups

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The impact of Pupil Premium provision is reviewed termly through analysis of each child's progress and achievement, and resulting improvement in self-esteem.

End of year achievement is compared to earlier starting points for each child, and against both cohort achievement and national standards.

Key Stage 2 children made accelerated progress compared to their peers in 2013-14. Average points progress for 2014-15 5.2 and for PP/E6 it is 6.0

Key Stage 1 children made accelerated progress compared to their peers in 2013-14. Average points progress for 2014-15 is 6.2, and for PP/E6 it is 6.7

Key stage testing changed in 2015-16. The way progress is measured has also changed.

KS2 outcomes are now measured by a scaled score, where 100 indicates children have met age expected standards.
