#### Department for Education Covid-19 Arrangements Over the Christmas Holidays

The Department for Education recommends all schools ensure staff, parents and carers are aware of the following information and relevant arrangements regarding positive cases in the holidays:

For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Families are asked to contact the school by email only as this is the only means of remote communication during this period. Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Parents and Carers should apply for a school place online at <u>www.suffolk.gov.uk/admissions</u>. Only those who are unable to apply online should complete and return a paper CAF1 application form which is available to download from <u>www.suffolk.gov.uk/admissions</u> or by contacting the team on 0345 600 0981.
