This morning the children have been learning archery and are delighted to be wearing their special campout hoodies. We are looking forward to our special lunch and are very grateful to Stour Valley Kitchen Catering who have made the special campout cake, pictured above, especially for the children for the campout.

Leavers' Service

We are very pleased to be allowed back into church for the end of term, as this is something children really identified as missing in their recent faith survey. We will say goodbye to our year 6s as a whole school. As part of the church's risk assessments, although the last day of term is 20th July, and therefore the day after planned easing of restrictions, we will only be able to accommodate the families of year 6 children in the church itself, and we have been asked to request that adults wear face masks for the service.

We are expecting the service to finish at approximately 2.00pm and children will be dismissed from the Church. Children in Key Stage 1 (Mars and Jupiter Class) will be dismissed from the main Church entrance and children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4 and 5) will be dismissed from the Vestry entrance and Year 6s may leave with their family members. Should any Year 6 child not have a family representative in the Church, they will be dismissed from the Key Stage 2 entrance unless they have permission to walk home unaccompanied. Parents with children in both Key Stages should collect their Key Stage 1 child first.

Lunch on the last day of term will be fish and chips, with alternatives as advised in the usual menu.

Summer Holiday Activities



Your isolation period includes the day your symptoms started (or the day your test was taken if you do not have symptoms), and the next 10 full days".
